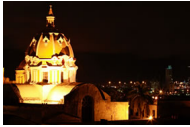

Airport

Cartagena's Rafael Núñez International Airport, located in the Crespo sector, in the northern

part of the city, is the second largest on the Colombian Coast. It was named after Rafael Núñez, a Colombian President and the author of the words of the National Anthem. The Sociedad Aeroportuaria de la Costa is in charge of its management since 1996. This Colombian company has the Spanish AENA (Aeropuertos Españoles y Navegación Aérea) as its operating partner.

How to get there

Being a Cultural and Tourism Destination, all means of transportation arrive in Cartagena, Colombia

From the north, the main access by land is from Barranquilla and Santa Marta; from the south, from Montería and Medellín. Cartagena has a modern transportation terminal in the Doña Manuela Sector, located on the Carretera de la Cordialidad. Address: Diagonal 57 N° 54-36. There are flights from the main cities in the country to Cartagena. Most international flights arrive at El Dorado International Airport in Bogotá, where it is necessary to take a connecting flight. Cities with international direct flights to Cartagena are Miami (Avianca), Madrid, and the cities of the Central American countries that connect to Panama City (Copa Airlines). It is also possible to arrive by sea in this beautiful city of the Colombian Caribbean. Close to 100 cruise ships from various destinations dock in Cartagena during the high season.

Transportation

Transcaribe: This is the name of the integrated transportation system of the District of Cartagena. At present, it is under construction, but soon it will change the appearance of the city and will facilitate everybody's vacations . It will be based on articulated buses that will cover the entire city, thanks to the fact that the city moves along a single axis.

This transportation system has 35 routes. The buses are privately owned and most of them tour the city from one end to the other.
