

Kyoto. “The colonial city of Cartagena de Indias in the Caribbean coast of Colombia has a history starring explorers, pirates, and royalty. The site features a photo depicting traditional colonial houses in Cartagena de Indias' historical downtown, which was declared a World Heritage Site in 1984.
