However, Colombiamoda is not the only world-renowned fair. There is also the [Medellín Flower Fair](#), which brings aromas and colors to the city when hundreds of peasants come down from the nearby mountains with flower-laden silleteras on their back. Silleteras are the traditional chair-like contraptions for carrying flowers and are profusely decorated for the fair.

Going to Medellín without touring its surroundings means missing out on an important part of the city's charm. Everyone should visit the neighboring towns, the traditional haciendas, and of course, the fondas, the traditional diners where visitors must try the *bandeja paisa*. This is the typical dish of the department of Antioquia that includes beans (its main ingredient), rice, chorizo sausage, avocado, fried egg,

*arepa*

, ripe plantain, and finely ground and condimented beef. Naturally, the dish must be preceded or accompanied by a drink of

*aguardiente*

(sugar cane spirits).

In the evening, nothing is better than a party in the atmosphere of paisa joviality and accompanied by the sounds of a good tango.

That's Medellín, a city of progress, tradition, industry, fashion. Impossible not to visit it.
