Santa ElenaThis tiny place is 20 minutes out of the city. It is the home of the men and women who devise complex and beautiful designs and mount them on stands (silletas) for the Festival of Flowers. Meat them, watch them, at work and discover local products and farmsteads.

Santa Fe de AntioquiaThis is one of Colombia's [magic villages](#),

redolent of history and tradition. The Puente de Occidente and tamarind candies are two famous attractions there.

Guatapé y el Peñón

Guatapé is an enchanting little village of colorful houses and every kind of decoration on the facings. Each has its own version of local window decoration with flowers and geometrical designs, many celebrating the 200th anniversary of the Republic. Five minutes away is the Peñón, a huge rock from which you can look out over the dam that swallowed up much of the mountains below. An exotic scene if ever there was one!
